STORY TO WATCH: LOWER CASCADES AND THE MAYOR'S PROPOSED ROAD CLOSURE



As has been discussed at a number of neighborhood meetings in recent months, Mayor Hamilton has again indicated his interest in closing the road through Lower Cascades from the south end of the park to Country Club Drive and converting it permanently to a bicycle-and-pedestrian-only path.

When the City did so as a pilot project in 2020, the *pilot* was approved by the Board of Public Works. Based on recent indications from the Administration, it is the Mayor's intention to bring legislation directly to City Council in the coming weeks or months.

Your feedback is important and very much needed. In working with both the Mayor and my colleagues, I have stressed the importance of seeking public input and I encourage both individuals and neighborhood organizations to follow this story closely.

2023 BLOOMINGTON COMMUNITY SURVEY OF RESIDENT OPINIONS NOW UNDERWAY

A random, scientific sample of 3,000 households will be mailed invitations to participate in the fourth community-wide, biennial, scientific survey of Bloomington residents. Administered by National Research Center, Inc. (NRC), the survey will ask residents for their perceptions about the quality and value of City services and current conditions in the community. This year's responses will be compared with previous three survey results and with a set of peer cities. Data gathered will help inform decision-making and identify shifts in public perceptions of City services and conditions.

Beginning on April 17th, residents not selected randomly may still participate in the survey by completing it online. The results of residents who opt-in will be collected, analyzed, and published in a separate data set.

CALL FOR PROPOSALS: 2023 RESIDENTIAL STORMWATER GRANTS

The City of Bloomington Utilities Department (CBU) invites homeowners to apply for funding through the fifth annual Residential Stormwater Grants Program. These small grants help pay for environmentally friendly, sustainable stormwater infrastructure projects like rain gardens, bioswales, and detention-pond maintenance on private, residential property.



Such features help control stormwater before it enters local waterways or the City's stormwater conveyance infrastructure. Improving stormwater management can reduce localized flooding and erosion and reduce pollutants entering local waterways since stormwater flows directly into our streams and water system without treatment.
